

Dear Parents and Carers,

Please can you ensure that **your 3 year old is toilet trained by the start of next term in January** unless they have an additional need which means this is not possible. Nursery staff are ready to work with you or you may prefer to do this over the Christmas break when nursery is closed.

Typically developing 3 year olds are more than ready to become independent toilet users and we are not being fair to them if we keep them in nappies for longer. T- Talk about secrets that upset you.
